At Home Three Period Lesson

The Three Period Lesson is a technique used to enrich vocabulary, to add language (standard, superlatives and comparatives). Before presenting language, the child should have a lot of experience with the material. If there is not enough experience, there is nothing to hang the language on. Technique aspects for each period:

- 1. First Period: Naming the Object
 - "This is..."
 - Making a connection in the brain, a neurological connection of both hemispheres of the brain).
 - Short period, but the name can be repeated.
 - No explanations, descriptions or definitions given, no discussion!
 - Establishes the neurological connection between image and vocabulary.
- 2. Second Period: Recognition of the Name
 - Series of commands like "Show me the _____." "Move the _____ here." "Hand me the ____."
 - Longest and most important period, it needs a variety of commands to keep it interesting and fun.
 - Neurological connection is strengthening through repetition.
 - Movement engages the motor cortex and stimulates more parts of the brain in this progress.
 - Every time the cells are stimulated they give more dendrites and connect, until there is a solid connection.
- 3. Third Period: Verification of the Name
 - Point to each object and ask "What is this?"
 - The child brings the new name from his own memory without assistance.
 - It is asked only one time, if more it creates second guessing.
 - If the child doesn't say the name correctly; simply end the lesson by naming each object correctly once more, the last impression that he has is accurate.
