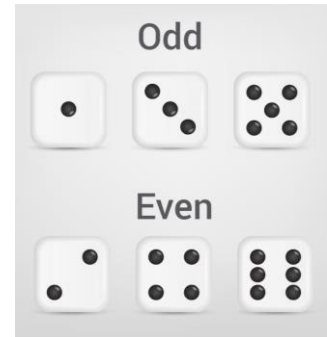


Even and Odd Dice Games

1. Playing with one dice.

- a. Show your child each face of the dice, have him count the dots and identify if it is odd or even.
- b. One player chooses to be even and the other will be odd.
- a. Make a T-chart with your names, and identify who is Odd and who is Even.
- b. Decide who goes first.
- c. Roll the dice.
- d. Decide who gets the point. If the number facing up belongs to the person that rolled it, he gets a tally.
- e. Make the corresponding tally on the chart.
- f. Next player rolls the dice.
- c. Alternate turns to roll the dice.
- d. Keep going until one gets to ten tallies. That person is the winner.



2. Playing with two dice.

- g. Review which are even numbers (2, 4, 6) and which are odd (1, 3, 5).
- h. Make a T-chart with your names.
- i. Decide who goes first.
- j. Roll 2 dice.
- k. Decide who gets the point. (See below)
- l. Make a tally on the chart.
- m. Next player rolls the dice.

Both dice are even or both are odd... say “**Match!**” and the roller gets the tally.
One is **even**, one is **odd**... say “**No match!**” and the other player (person who did not roll) gets the tally.

Challenge: One player is ODD; the other player is EVEN. Roll both dice. Find the total. If it's even, the even player gets the tally. If it's odd, the odd player gets the tally.
