Parents Instructions-Folding Cloths

Materials: Basket or tray, square cloths, 12" x 12", each has different indicating lines marked with a colored pencil or marker, or sewn into the cloth with a contrasting thread. One cloth has no indicator line.

Purposes: Visual motor coordination, care of the environment, and preparation for Geometry.

Steps:

- 1. The child sits, you sit on his right side, and place the tray on the stool in front of you.
- 2. Take one cloth at a time from the tray with finger pinch on both corners closer to you; and place it in front of the child.
- 3. Fold the cloth; see next page, Cloths 1 to 5 for the specific steps for each one.
- 4. After each cloth is folded place it on the left side of the table. Line the cloths vertically from top to bottom.
- 5. When done with folding, show the child how to unfold and put them back in the tray, one by one.
 - a. Bring the last cloth folded in front of the child, taking it from one corner with finger pinch.
 - b. Lift it to the air to let it unfold.
 - c. Take the other corner with the other hand and place it in the tray.
 - d. Repeat until done with all the cloths.
- 6. Invite the child to do the exercise.
- 7. Fade and observe.
- 8. When completed, after all the repetitions he wants to do, remind him to put it back.

Notes:

- Avoid creasing.
- We fold from the bottom to the top so the lines appear automatically on the bottom once is folded.

Following Exercises:

• Folding napkins, placemats, other cloths, aprons, socks or any type of clothing; or papers

Cloth 1

- 1. Take cloth 1 by the one corner with finger pinch and take the other corner with the other hand with finger pinch; and place it in front of the child.
- 2. Rotate so the stitches are parallel to the edge of the table; Point the stitches all the way long without touching them.
- 3. Put one hand facing down to the upper part of the cloth, on the triangle over the stitches.
- 4. With the other hand take with finger pinch the corner pointing to the child; pause to look at it and bring it to the opposite corner; matching both corners.
- 5. Hold both corners and take out the hand.
- 6. Lift slightly the cloth to draw the attention to the stitches, pointing the line all the way through.
- 7. Put the folded cloth at the top left side of the table.

Cloth 2

- 1. Take cloth 2 by the left corner with finger pinch and take the other corner with the other hand; and place it in front of the child.
- 2. Rotate so the stitches are parallel to the edge of the table; Point the stitches all the way long without touching them.
- 3. Take left corner finger pinch with left hand and right corner finger pinch with right hand; pause and bring both corners to their opposite corners to match them.
- 4. Lift slightly the cloth to draw the attention to the stitches, pointing the line all the way through.
- 5. Put the folded cloth at the left side of the table, under Cloth 1.

Cloth 3

- 1. The same as Cloth 1
- 2. Rotate and repeat.
- 3. Put the folded cloth at the left side of the table, under Cloth 2.

Cloth 4

- 1. The same as Cloth 2
- 2. Rotate and repeat.
- 3. Put the folded cloth at the left side of the table, under Cloth 3.

Cloth 5

- 1. Take cloth 5 by the left corner with finger pinch, take the other corner with the other hand, and place it in front of the child.
- 2. Dialogue: "This one doesn't have stitches, I'm going to fold it however I want."
- 3. Fold it and put it at the end on the table, behind the others.
